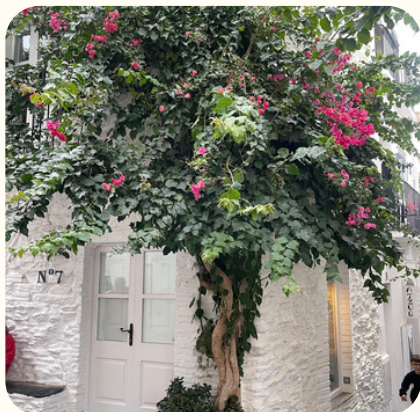
If you prefer staying at an airport hotel the night before, you’re still completely looked after: they’ll take you there and collect you the next morning to whisk you straight to the terminal.

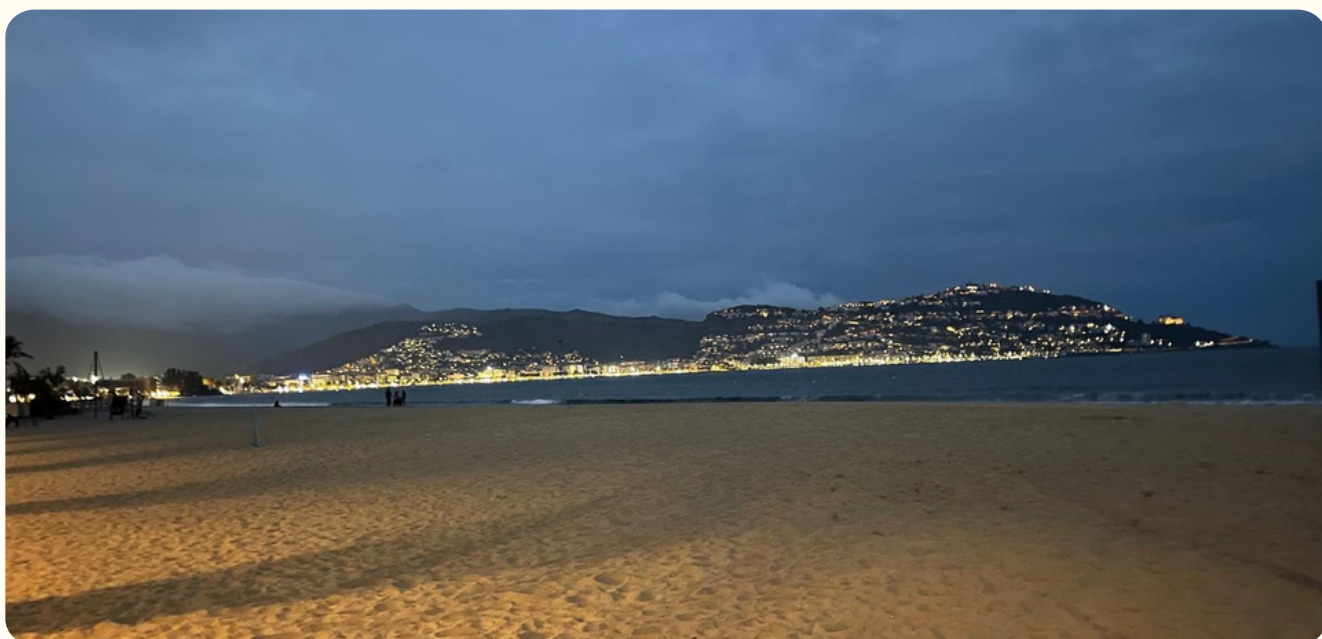

There are plenty of small shops tucked around the village, ideal for picking up a few gifts or souvenirs before the trip came to a close.

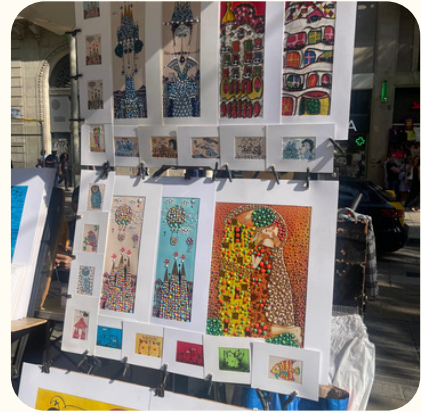


Last Day
